

## अत्यावश्यक

छात्र—प्रताड़ना माननीय उच्चतम न्यायालय के आदेशानुसार एक दण्डनीय अपराध है। हिमाचल प्रदेश शैक्षणिक संस्था रैगिंग (रैगिंग का प्रतिषेध) अध्यादेश, 2009 उपधारा (1) के उपबंधों का उल्लंघन करने व दोष सिद्ध होने पर कारावास जिसकी अविध तीन वर्ष की हो सकेगी या जुर्माना जो पचास हजार रूपये तक हो सकेगा या दोनों से दण्डित किया जा सकेगा। इसमें संलिप्त होने से बचें। रैगिंग एक दण्डनीय अपराध है। इसके अन्तर्गत यदि कोई विद्यार्थी किसी अन्य विद्यार्थी को शारीरिक व मानसिक रूप से प्रताड़ित करता है या प्रताड़ना का भय बलपूर्वक अथवा अन्य रूप से उत्पन्न करता है, जिससे किसी विद्यार्थी के आत्मसम्मान को ठेस पहुंचती हो या भय का वातावरण उत्पन्न होता हो ''छात्र—प्रताड़ना'' की परिधि में आता है। इसके अतिरिक्त अपशब्दों का प्रयोग और घूर कर देखना भी छात्र—प्रताड़ना माना जाता है। यदि कोई विद्यार्थी किसी भी गतिविधि में संलिप्त पाया जाता है तो उसके विरुद्ध कड़ी दण्डात्मक कार्यवाही निम्नलिखित रूप से की जाती है:

- महाविद्यालय से निलम्बन व निष्कासन।
- 2. सार्वजनिक क्षमा याचना के साथ जुर्माना।
- 3. छात्रवृति व अन्य सुविधाओं से वंचित करना।
- महाविद्यालय की विभिन्न गतिविधियों में सहभागी होने पर प्रतिबंध।
- 5. कानून के अन्तर्गत कार्यवाही जिसके अन्तर्गत तीन साल की कैद या पचास हजार जुर्माना अथवा दोनों।

## **VERY IMPORTANT**

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power of senior students is brought to bear on freshly enrolled or in any way considered junior by other students which involves physical and psychological assault or threat to other students of use of force or violation of dignity and honour of such student or expose students to ridicule and affect their self-esteem or entail verbal abuse, aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.

Any student found involved in ragging will be punished strictly by the college authorities and such penalization may include

- 1. Suspension / Expulsion from the college
- 2. Fine with a public apology.
- 3. Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
- 4. Debarring from the representation in events.
- 5. Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess.
- 6. Legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated. It includes imprisonment for a term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend to 50,000/- or with both.

## 1. INTRODUCTION

Government Degree College Jhandutta was established in 2007 with the H.P. Govt. Notification No. EDN-A-CHHA (7) 1/2007 dated Feb. 06, 2007 to provide educational facilities to the students of the far-flung areas, specifically of Kot Dhar. From the Session 2016-17 the college is functioning at its own premises. In the new campus the new college building was inaugurated by the Hon'able Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh in July 12, 2016 and thereafter the college is functioning in the new campus. From the academic session 2017-18 the science classes have also been started in the college for the undergraduate courses vide HP Govt. Notification No. EDN-11(8)A(1)-69/89-2009 (new subject, Directorate of Higher Edu. Dated 22 June 2017. The college is imparting higher education in the field of humanities, commerce and sciences (Medical & Non Medical) offering Under Graduate Degree courses in Arts (B.A.), Commerce (B.Com) and Science (B.Sc.). The institution is fulfilling the aspirations of the youth in getting their higher education dreams. It is also fulfilling the universalization of higher education needs, one of the prominent goals of the state govt. particularly in the rural areas, of the state. The institution is situated in the rural area of Distt. Bilaspur at Jhandutta assembly segment. From the past record the institution is imparting higher education to the students enrolled mainly from the rural areas and out of the total students enrolled about 70% are girls. The institution is making remarkable progress in imparting higher education since its inspection.

## 1.2 Courses of Study

The Govt. College Jhandutta, Distt. Bilaspur (HP) is offering the following Degree Programmes:-

Sr. No.	Programme (UG)	Duration
1	B.A.	3 yrs.
2	B.Com.	3 yrs.
3	B.Sc.	3 yrs.

These above UG programmes are available for both Boys & Girls and hereby this is a coeducation institution.

The students enrolled in UG courses will be offered certificate courses in:

1. MS World,

2. MS Excel/ Tally

3. Latex / PPT

4. Sustainable Development.

5. Value based courses

6. Yoga & Meditation

All the students will have to opt for any of the courses at institutional level.

## 1.3 Guidelines For Admission

The H.P. University has started semester system of examination with Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under Rashtriya Uchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) from Session 2013 -14. The candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a period not less than three years or more than five academic years from the date of admission. A candidate will not be allowed more than three attempts to pass a course.

## 1.4 Eligibility conditions

- i) Passed +2 Examination (in any academic stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H.P. University.
- ii) Provided that a student who has passed qualifying examination in Arts Stream admitted in B.A. programme for admission.
- iii) Provided that a student who has passed qualifying examination in commerce stream will be given preference in B.Com. programme for admission.
- iv) Provided that a student who has passed qualifying examination in science stream will be given preference in B.Sc. programme for admission.



- v) Provided that if a student who passed 10+2 exam in other than Commerce stream and want to seek admission in Commerce (B.Com. 1st year) the candidate must have passed his/her 10+2 exam with Economics or Mathematics as one of the subjects (As per HPU ordinance Volume 1, Chapter 1, Page no. 41 & 42, Rule no. (ii).
- vi) Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal may refuse admission, if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark and satisfaction to the authority during previous year.
- vii) A student disqualified / expelled / rusticated by any university shall not be admitted to any course during his / her disqualification period. (HPU Ordinance No. 3.6).
- viii) The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.

## 1.5 Upper Age Limit

- i) 25 years for girls and 23 years for boys as on July 1, 2024. 3 years relaxation is available for SC / ST students as per rules.
- ii) The Vice-Chancellor, H.P.U. in exceptional cases / circumstances, to be recorded in writing, may give relaxation in upper age limit up to a maximum of six months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- iii) Relaxation in upper age limit is also available to physically disabled candidates.

## 2 CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (NEW)

The New Choice Based Credit System has been introduced in all the colleges of the state from the academic session 2015-16 by the Himachal Pradesh University and it has been approved by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh. In this system 132 credits are necessary for a student to get under graduate degree in any streams i.e. Arts, Commerce & Science. The state Govt. has almost adopted the CBCS as notified and prescribed by UGC and Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Govt. of India. In the present CBCS system every student has to undergo the various courses for the award of their UG Degree. These courses are mandatory for all faculties i.e. Humanities, Commerce & Science. These are:

## 2.1 Proposed Scheme for Choice Based Credit System in BA

## 3. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION FOR UG DEGREE COURSES (Yearly System)

**EVALUATION SYSTEM**: All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following components:

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% for 1st, 2nd & 3rd year and 70% accounting for HPU end semester examination for grade that a student gets in a course. The 30% assessment for Ist, 2nd & 3rd year will be determined on the bases of class room attendance, mid term test, assignments, workshops and seminars. The HPU end semester examination will be of three hours duration and will cover the whole syllabus of the course. Odd semester examination will be in the month of October/November and for the even semester, it will be in the month of April/May. The Schedule of HPU end semester examinations is being issued by the affiliating university i.e. Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. The schedule of the HPU for the conduct of end semester examination at local examination centre is being strictly adhered by the institution.

#### 4. DOCUMENTS & CERTIFICATES REQUIRED:

#### B.A/B.Com./B.Sc. 1st, 2nd year & 3rd Year

- i. Original documents along with Photostat copies of School / Board / University certificates from Matriculation Onwards (Internet Copy not valid)
- ii. Three passport-size photographs, one each to be pasted on the admission form, identity card-cum-library card and library registration form.
- iii. Character certificate in original from the Head of Institution last attended or a character certificate should have been issued by a gazetted officer or Panchayat Pradhan in the case of private candidates.
- iv. The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of admission form.
- v. Migration Certificate in original is to be enclosed with the H.P. University Registration form (Only for the students who have passed their qualifying examination from other than H.P. Board of School Education).



- vi. Certificate of SC / ST from Magistrate Class 1 in prescribed proforma for those seeking relaxation in age / marks.
- vii. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence / affidavit as the proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap. If the gap is 3 years or more, the candidate will not be admitted.
- Viii. Bonafide Himachali Certificate for the exemption of tuition fee (only for girl students), Admission without any of these documents will not be entertained.

### ROLL-ON SYSTEM OF ADMISSION :

Admission is open for all students on Roll on Basis, who are otherwise eligible, with out waiting the result of previous year. It means that students of B.Com./ B.A./ B.Sc.1st & 2nd Year will get admission to the next year. without waiting the result. Admission will be allowed only as per University Schedule. However, he / she will have to fulfill all the formalities laid down by the college authorities like uploading the documents and depositing the prescribed fees etc.

There is no provision of admission as per University Ordinance after 30th June every year and as per Hon'ble High court Decision. No admission will be given after the schedule.

#### 6. ADMISSION AND MIGRATION

Admission to all the degree classes will be made on roll on system without waiting for the result of H.P. University. Admission will be provisional and the admission of eligible candidates will be regularised after the declaration of their results. Monthly fees for three months (unrefundable) alongwith admission fee (unrefundable) will be charged from the students at the time of provisional admission and it will be adjusted at the time of regularization of eligible candidates.

- Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committees constituted for the purpose.
- ii. A candidate seeking admission to first year must be accompanied by his / her parents/ guardian at the time of
- iii. All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of Vice Chancellor, H.P.U. Shimla.
- iv. Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility conditions fixed by H.P.U. Shimla/H.P.Govt.

Note: Rules for admission are subject to change as per H.P.U. Notification / H.P. Govt. directions.

### 7. FEES AND FUNDS:

- i Every student must pay the dues on the dates notified from time to time.
- Ii. Admission Fee, Tuition Fee & Registration fee will not be charged from a student who migrates from some other college if he / she is already registered with H.P. University. Other dues will have to be paid for the whole session.

- ii. Exemption of tuition fee will be available to the Himachali girls only, subject to the production of Bonafide Himachali Certificate.
- iii. Disabled male students with more than 40% disability will be exempted from tuition fee subject to the production of disability certificate issued by the competent medical authority at the time of admission.
- iv. Exemption of PTA fund will be available for one student in case of real brothers or sisters.

## 8. SCHOLARSHIPS/CONCESSIONS:

- viii. Merit-cum-Poverty Scholarships (From Local PTA Fund)

The concerned students are advised to have all the required certificates/ documents from the concerned authorities and after obtaining the scholarship forms from the college office, they should submit it complete in all respects in the college office as per schedule notified from time to time.

Notification No. F/L-27/2009 (SCT) dated Feb 26, 2015

As per MHRD New Delhi directions and UGC recomendations the eligible SC/ST, OBC, PWD students etc. should submit their scholarship forms for the academic year by February for processing scholarship to SC/ST, OBC, PWD etc. each year.

#### FINES AND PENALITIES :

- i. Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Rs. 5 per day.
- ii. In case a student does not deposit his / her dues in advance his / her name will be struck off the roll at the end of the month.
- iii. The name of the students shall also be struck off of the roll of the college if he / she remains absent, without leave for continuous 10 days or more.
- iv. If the name of a student is struck off, he / she must be accompanied by his / her father or mother at the time of re-admission.
- v. In case, the name of a student is struck off, re-admission is permissible, with a fine of Rs. 100.00, only after the recommendation of concerned teachers.



- vi. If the name of a student is struck off for the second time, he / she will have to pay a fine of Rs. 200.00. A student will not be admitted if his / her name is struck off for the third time.
- vii. Once name is struck off, the student must readmit himself / herself within seven days after that he / she will have to pay a fine of Rs. 10/- per day at the time of re-admission.
- viii. The Principal can expel a student from the college if he / she is found guilty of misconduct.
- ix. Every student will have to procure No Dues certificate from the college librarian/fee clerk / N.S.S. Programme officer / Sports incharge if he / she wants to leave the college.
- x. The library security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of his / her leaving the college.
- xi. Late return of library books Rs. 1/Day

#### 10 OTHER FINES WILL BE AS BELOW:

- i. Absence for one period Re. 1/-
- ii. Absence per practical Rs. 3/-
- iii. Absence in House Examination: Rs. 100/-per paper

Students are advised to preserve fee receipts Identity cards etc. issued by the college. In case a fee receipt or Identity card is lost, Photocopy or a duplicate Identity card can be obtained from the college office on payment of Rs. 20/- (Rs. Twenty Only).

**Note**: The above rates are subject to change by H.P. Govt. from time to time.

### 11. LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS:

- i. A student can proceed on leave with prior permission of the Principal but the application should also be signed by the parent / guardian of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
- ii. A tutor can sanction leave upto 3 days while a leave application upto 7 days is to be sanctioned by the chief tutor. Leave for more than seven days is to be sanctioned by the Principal Only.
- iii. The application must be got sanctioned by the applicant himself / herself and he /she must ensure that the concerned subject teachers have noted down the leave. Application being brought for sanction by some other student will not be considered.
- iv. Leave on account of illness if it is for more than three days, must be accompained by a medical certificate or Registration Slip.
- v. Student may proceed on any kind of leave but he / she must deposit his / her fees/ fines on the appointed day. Otherwise his / her admission will stand cancelled.
- vi. Students, who go for participation in various inter college games or other competitions, will have to get their leave sanctioned and noted down by the concerned subject teachers before their departure for the participation.
- vii. Leave during house examinations will be sanctioned by the Principal after the recommendation of the concerned subject teachers in special cases only.



### 12. MID-TERM TEST AND CLASS ATTENDANCE:

- i. Mid term test (MTT) of 15 marks will be held in each semester. Every Student will have to appear in the MTT and score at least 35% marks in each subject [H.P.U. ord. No. 6.2 (c)].
- ii. A student who fails to show satisfactory result in the M.TT. shall forfeit his claim to fee concession or other financial assistance.
- iii. Every student must attend at least 75% lectures both in theory and practical separately. Otherwise his / her examination form will not be forwarded to the University. [H.P.U. ord no. 6.2 (6)].
- iv. The Principal can condone the shortage in lectures in respect of those students who have to miss classes on account of their participation in N.S.S., sports, cultural or academic activities.
- v. Internal Assessment will be made on the basis of class attendance/assignments/Seminars and marks obtained in MTT.
- vi Students have to pass both in internal assessments and end term exam. separately.
- vii. A students has to pass in internal assessment, practical and end semester examination with 35% in each separately and 45% in aggregate in all these for passing the UG Degree Course.

## 13. ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION AND RULES FOR PRIZES:

Prize Distribution Function of the College is held in the end of the session and various prizes such as academic, sports and cultural are awarded to the students to encourage the, students standing first and second in aggregate and in the subjects are felicitated subject to fulfilment of other conditions such as those, who are claiming first or second prizes in aggregate must not have less than 50% marks in aggregate and those who are claiming prizes for standing first or second in a subject must have at least 50% marks in concerned subject and must have been passed in all the subjects. In case the number of students in a subject is less than 10, there will be only first prize. Similarly for college level competitions in sports / NSS and all other curricular activity excluding academics if the number of teams / students in less than 5, no prize is to be awarded.

## 14. SCIENCE LABORATORIES & EQUIPMENTS

The College has started the science classes in both Med & Non Med. for UG Degree Programme from the academic session 2017-18. In order to provide the laboratories & equipments for the science students, the College has developed and well equipped science laboratories for the science course in the subjects of Chemistry, Physics, Botany & Zoology. For the purchase of science equipments the College has spent Rs. 6 Lakhs in the academic session 2017-18.

#### 15. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME:

The college has a half unit of N.S.S. The enrolement is made by the Programme Officer on the basis of selection. All interested students will have to apply to join N.S.S. The purpose of NSS is to provide the facility of NSS students with the society through community development programme during the academic year.

## 16. Rovers & Rangers

The college has an active half unit of Rovers & Rangers under Bharat Scouts & Guides, a voluntary organisation devoted to development of character of youth and inculating the value of selfless service.



Apart from regular activities on campus the volunteers also attend special camps from time to time and equip themselves with vital life skills to cope with present day challenges.

#### 17. COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

The edition of college magazine is printed out ever year for the students. The name of the college magazine is "RUKMANIDHARA" The college magazine includes 7 sections viz. English, Hindi, Pahari, Sanskrit, Planning, Commerce & Science. The students of the college can give their interest's articles in any of these sections. The articles after screening by the student editor then by the teacher editor shall be incorporated in the magazine. The articles should be of original. The college magazine promote the opportunity of the students to explore their creative, new and original ideas. The college students get benefitted and enriched themselves with the articles given in the college magazine and also get motivated for the new things to be added in the magazine for the next academic session.

### 18. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

- i. Every effort will be made by the college administration to maintain a conductive and healthy environment in the college. For maintaining discipline, the Principal can impose fine, suspension or expulsion of any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as listed below:-
- ii. Ragging is banned in the institution and any act of ragging will be severely dealt with, Ragging implies harassment / Physical or mental torture by a student or a group of students to another student. Any student found associated in such nefarious activities will be guilty of gross misconduct and it can cause his/her expulsion from the college.
- iii. Use of Mobile phones in the college is strictly banned by the government. Any student caught using mobile phone in the campus will be find Rs. 100 to Rs. 500.
- iv. Anybody found guilty of writing obscenities / dirty words on blacks boards, walls or furniture.
- v. Raising noise near class rooms or attempting to distrub classes.
- vi. Smoking or taking drugs / alcohol / chewing gum / gutkha etc, [A fine of Rs. 100/- (minimum) will be imposed for the offence].
- vii. To damage plants in the campus.
- viii. To fiddle with the electric installations.
- ix. To indulge in any rash / unbecoming behaviour.
- x. To use unfair means in the examinations.
- xi. To bring outsiders to the campus is strictly prohibited and it may attract heavy fines, rustication and even expulsion.
- xii. To paste notices, hand bills, pamphlets on the walls of buildings. It can cause fines / rustication etc.
- xiii. Every student must carry his/her identity card which is issued to the students after admission. Students who



participate in sports or extra curricular activities / educational tours must produce written permission from their parents / guardians before planning for the excursion tours.

### 19. COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION:

Parents-Teacher's Association has been formed in the college to assist the college authorities to undertake development activities and also to develop a rapport between the parents and the teachers for the smooth functioning of the college. There should be a constructive interaction between the parents and the teachers. Its objectives are:

- i) To arrange time to time discussion with the senior persons of the society and to incorporate their suggestions for the improvement of educational standards in the College.
- ii) There will be a general body P.T.A., of which the parents or guardians (in case parents are not alive and only those guardians who are blood relatives of the student) teachers. The head of the institution i.e. Principal will be the patron of P.T.A.
- iii) Parents / guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers for the progress of their wards in the college. The valuable suggestions of the parents are always welcome and the institutions inculcates these valuable suggestions positively for the all round developments and welfare of the college students.
- iv) Whenever the parents / guardians are requested to meet the Principal in connection with some problems regarding their wards they should response positively and contact college authority well in time.
- v) The PTA of the college has started merit-cum-poverty scholarship for the college students from the academic session 2017-18. This scholarship is given to those students who did not get any scholarship either from state or central govt. sponsor scholarships scheme. There is no limit / restriction on member of beneficiary from P.T.A. subject to the available of funds in the P.T.A. Under this merit-cum-poverty scholarship the eligible students are identified by a committee constituted for the purpose and a cash prize for deserving students shall be given during the annual prize distribution function of the college. In 2018-19 five such scholarships has been awarded Rs.9500/-.

# Ragging A Punishable Offence

Ragging Means any act. conduct or practice by which dominant power of senior students is brought to bear on the freshly enrolled or in any way considered junior by other students which involves physical and psychological assault or threat to other students or use of force or violation of diginity and honour of such student or expose students to ridicule and affect their self esteem or entail verbal abuse, aggression, indecent gestures and obscence behavior.

Any student found involved in ragging will be punished strictly by the college authorities and such penalization may include:-

- Suspension / Expulsion from the college.
- 2. Fine with a public apology.
- 3. Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
- Debarring from the repersentation in events.
- Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess.
- 6. Legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated. It includes imprisionment for a term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend to 50,000/- or with both.
